#### PLEASE DO NOT

"get on" your son for poor play

make negative comments about any player

encourage your son to be selfish (eg.. "shoot it Billy" or "don't pass to him!!") hover at practices or games. Please SIT IN STANDS or designated area.

question referees decisions

question the coaches decisions

cheer for unnecessary hitting or violent play

say "hit the goalie" when opposition goalie leaves the crease

yell anything deemed inappropriate by the coaching staff

- 1. hit him
- Nail him
- Get him
- Crush him.

Yell Anything that encourages hitting or violent behavior (it is completely inappropriate!!)

COACH FROM THE SIDELINES

Eg. Pass the ball, come on guys run a play!!

Parents do this in all sports and don't realize how devisive it is!!

Tell your son it was someone elses fault, we all need to accept responsibilty for our actions Eg. "that was a bad call, Billy. The Ref is out to get you, or is watching you too closely"
